## Strength in Joining Together

Fourteen years ago, two mothers, Merle Hatleberg (founder of Someone Cares) and So Ching Lee (the mother of the founders of Wahoo's Fish Tacos), made a deal that has since changed the lives of many in our community. It began with a dream and a handshake and the unification of two families.



Merle's vision for feeding those in need tugged on the heartstrings of the Lee family. It was then that So Ching sold Merle a building that today is home to Someone Cares Soup Kitchen and Tutoring Program.

Founded in 1986, Someone Cares has grown to become one of the most impactful non-profit organizations serving folks throughout Orange County serving 350 people daily across eight cities, including Costa Mesa, Newport Beach and Huntington Beach. From the working poor and economically disadvantaged to families with school-aged children, senior citizens, mentally and/or physically challenged as well as, of course, the homeless.

The Lee family also has greatly expanded their influence. Wahoo's Fish Taco—founded by So Ching's sons Wing, Ed and Mingo in 1988—is now a community mainstay and worldwide pop culture phenomenon. With an eclectic Mexican/Brazilian/Asian menu and a Hawaiian North Shore vibe, the restaurant has gained a loyal and steady following while staying true to its authentic roots.

But both remain true and dedicated partners to an important and necessary cause—helping those in need.

Today, Wahoo's Fish Taco remains a faithful advocate of the Someone Cares Soup Kitchen cause. The Lee family also supports other influential non-profits including Share Our Strength, a national organization that works hard to make sure “no kid in America grows up hungry,” and Vocational Visions, a Mission Viejo-based agency that provides vocational, life-skills training and other services to adults with various disabilities.
